

Wildlife attractant Scavenger hunt

your mission

You will be investigating the biggest cause of human-wildlife conflict in BC: unnatural food or wildlife attractants. Wildlife attractants are human-related things like garbage and birdseed that can attract wildlife into our backyards. When wild animals find these foods in a town, it often results in conflict with people. For instance, imagine a black bear finds a bag of garbage full of tasty leftovers in your backyard. That bear will learn that your yard is a good place to find food and may return again and again to find more. This can create a dangerous situation for you and your family, but also for the bear!

YOUR MISSION: for this activity, you will head out on a scavenger hunt, looking for the wildlife attractants listed on the next page. Start in your backyard and then head around the block, trying to find as many wildlife attractants as you can and filling out the worksheet as you go. You might be surprised by the amount of unnatural food available to wildlife in your neighbourhood!

As Junior Rangers, we know that we can prevent conflicts by keeping all wildlife attractants securely stored out of wildlife's reach. By locking up our garbage, we can keep wildlife wild and our community safe!

what you will need:

- A printed copy of this Activity Guide
- Pencil
- Clipboard or something hard to write on
- An adventure partner (a parent or friend)

before you go:

Keep in mind that different wildlife species will be attracted to different food items, a flower garden might not be of much interest to a bear, but what about a deer? Think about the diets of different wild animals as you work through this activity.

Safety first! Be sure to bring a trusted adventure partner with you (parents are great for this!). Do not go onto your neighbours' properties- you can do the whole activity from the sidewalk!
